Bengal Delta had been an important maritime destination for traders from all parts of the world. The actual location of the port of call varied from time to time in line with the natural hydrographic changes. From the early decades of the second millennium AD, traders from the European continent also joined the traders from the Arab countries, who had been the Forerunners in maritime trading with India.
